## "Come near to the radio and let's pray together"

In a recent email I shared the story of Rajesh, who recently passed away – not from Covid. He got sick and could not be treated due to Covid-created conditions. He was born into an orthodox Hindu family, grew up in poverty, and became addicted to drugs and alcohol.

One day, someone told his wife of a radio program. When she tuned in to listen, she heard the pastor say, "If you believe God can change your life, just believe and I will pray with you. In faith reach out, come near to the radio and let's pray together." And she did. Rajesh was healed from his addiction and began to share Jesus with the marginalised in Delhi.











## "The gospel in their own dialect for the very first time"

Recently, 100 shortwave radio units were delivered to Sittwe (which means "the place where the war meets"). As a result, a minority ethnic group can now tune into the gospel in their own dialect **for the very first time**.

Not only that, but because the radios were fitted with SD cards, prerecorded programs can be accessed by listeners anytime! One of our partners on the ground was heard to say, "I hope that the Lord will use these to bring the least, the lost, and the last to His Kingdom." This captures the heart of our prayers.

We truly do have lots to be grateful for!

In places of disease and war, of sickness and death, we bring messages of an eternal hope to those who desperately need it. But the work we are involved in is more challenging than ever.
